**Department Reports**

**Highway:** Highway Superintendent Dobrovosky submitted his report to the Board for their review.

Highway Superintendent Dobrovosky requested the Board declare the Gradall in the Highway Department as surplus. This request is part of ongoing fleet management and equipment updates.

On a motion of Councilor Alexander, seconded by Councilor Dove and with unanimous (4-0) affirmation of the Town Board, the Highway Department Gradall was declared surplus.

**Transfer Station: Municipal** Recycling Liaison Brian Buff reported the Transfer Station had sent out fourteen loads of trash, six open top containers and four loads of recycling.

Mr. Buff asked the board to approve a quote for the removal of the household hazardous waste that they had been mandated to remove by the NYS DEC. He stated he had received two quotes:

Mr. Buff recommended Clean Harbors and asked the Board for authorization.

On a motion of Councilor Alexander, seconded by Councilor Milne and with unanimous (4-0) affirmation of the Town Board, the Town Board authorized Mr. Buff to proceed with Clean Harbors, Environmental Services for the removal of household hazardous waste at the Town of Skaneateles Transfer Station for an amount of \$4,414.00.

**Planning and Zoning:** Supervisor Legg reviewed the report as submitted by Planning Secretary Karen Barkdull. He ported there were five applications for the Planning Board. And open projects: Finger Lakes Fabric, Johnson, SUNN 1077 LLC, Byrne Dairy, Schnapp, Winkelman, Foote and Lakelawn. Other activities included eight pre-application meetings, an Open Space Committee work session, Shoreline Committee work session, P&Z Staff work session, 4 hours of Codes Enforcement training, final draft of the Shoreline Code and the Water Protection Code, and the Shoreline Guidelines finalized.

**Codes:** Officer Herrmann reviewed the March Codes Office report. He stated there were forty-nine expired permits at this time. The Highway department had done maintenance on the code's vehicle. Amy Dell had been working on the fire inspection scheduling. He reported he would be attending the Annual NYSBOC conference April 8<sup>th</sup> – 10<sup>th</sup>.

**Parks:** Parks Manager Sue Murphy reported Playday registration was completed and over two hundred campers had registered. The Parks is looking for summer employees; Playday councilors, summer laborers and lifeguards. Farmers Market begins in May and baseball starts this week at the parks. They removed the old shed and are waiting for the new shed. The Sims building will be opening as soon as the weather breaks.

**Water:** Supervisor Legg reported Shane Christman Water Department Foreman had his last day and has moved on to another position with City of Syracuse Police Department and the Board wished him success. The Water Department was reviewing and interviewing candidates and, in the meantime, Frank Lessaongang is covering for the department. Frank has completed the process of getting his Water Operator license.

**Budget:** Budget Officer Keri Fey reported Amy Dell had been working out well and Ms. Fey thanked the Board for authorizing this position. They are continuing to work towards the payroll switch to Paychex.

Budget Officer Fey requested the Town Board consider declaring the cemetery John Deere x1500 mower as surplus. Their new John Deer mower had arrived, and they would like to put the old mower up for auction.

On a motion of Councilor Alexander, seconded by Councilor Dove and with unanimous (4-0) affirmation of the Town Board, the cemetery John Deere X15 mower as declared surplus.

**Skaneateles Loves Canada:** Supervisor Legg stated there is a group of residents that would like to make a presentation regarding our local relationship with Canada. Mr. Paul Fiutak was here to present to the Board.

Mr. Fiutak stated he was present this evening to introduce a group in our community that share concerns about our neighboring residents of Canada. Mr. Fiutak stated he lived on East Lake Road and had lived here for 30 years. Mr. Fiutak explained Holly Gregg and himself were here to express the thoughts of the group regarding international events beyond our control and their affect on our the close-knit relationship between the US and Canada.

Mr. Fiutak stated this is starting to affect our Skaneateles community and tourism. They had met with the Skaneateles Chamber of Commerce and the Village of Skaneateles.

Mr. Fiutak stated this is not a political group and he hoped the Town Board would support their efforts.

Holly Gregg reported they had a resolution that they would like the Town Board to consider. The resolution stated the Skaneateles Town Board expressed its respectful regard for its Canadian

neighbors. He would like to take this human approach and make Canadians feel Skaneateles is a safe haven. He also wanted to make this a campaign with the local merchants to hang flags and posters in support of Canada throughout the community. This is an opportunity for Skaneateles to promote welcoming our Canadian neighbors.

Mr. Gregg stated the group's goal was for the Town and Village Boards to support this idea and he presented the Town Board with a resolution for consideration.

Patience Brewster stated she was in support of this welcoming effort for the Canadian community and hoped the board would give their support.

Supervisor Legg stated he appreciated their A-Political efforts, but the Town Board would have to recognize their actions are federal actions not a local effort. The Town of Skaneateles has a policy to only fly the American flag at its facilities. The Town did not take a stand on the crisis in the Ukrainian by flying the Ukrainian flag at our facilities what Board members do on their own is separate from their position on the Town Board.

Supervisor Legg stated he is a member of the Skaneateles Sunrise Rotary, and they had a successful campaign in support of Ukrainians and were able to raise \$20,000.

Supervisor Legg stated he appreciated their efforts, but the Town Board had never been affected by national policies and ideology. He applauded their actions as private citizens.

The Town Board agreed, they applauded their actions as public citizens, but it was not a policy of the Town Board.

**7:00 p.m. Public Hearing Local Law 2 of 2025 "Schedule VII: Truck Exclusions":** Supervisor Legg reviewed the proposed Local Law 2 of 2025. This Local Law was to specify additional roadways where trucks, tractors and tractor-trailer combinations in excess of the indicated maximum gross weights are to be excluded. These roads were not designed to be truck routes due to maintenance and safety. The list is as follows:

On a motion of Councilor Alexander, seconded by Councilor Milne and with unanimous (4-0) affirmation of the Town Board, the public hearing for Local Law #2 of 2025 “A Local Law Amending Town Code Schedule VII: Truck Exclusion” was opened.

**Holland Gregg, 3872 Jordan Road:** Mr. Gregg stated the Village of Aurora has the same problem and has had to redo their main road. He stated the Board is on the right track and this is a wonderful idea. He commended the Board.

**Paul Fiutak, 2742 East Lake Road:** Mr. Fiutak stated he had been involved in truck traffic on Route 41 in Skaneateles for 20 years and he is in support of this Local Law.

**Lisa Lincoln, 778 Franklin Street:** Ms. Lincoln stated her family had lived on Franklin Street for 33 years and the traffic had increased and especially truck traffic. She was in full support of this local law.

**Holland Gregg:** Mr. Gregg asked what the enforcement would be. Supervisor Legg stated the NYS Troopers and Onondaga County Sheriffs would enforce the local law. They would have the authority to issue citations if there were violations or accidents. The Town would also install signs posting the exclusion.

Supervisor Legg stated he would also be calling the local companies that would be affected by this law.

Councilor Alexander stated local deliveries and farming are exempt. The Town has seen an increase in truck traffic, and this is a good thing.

Mr. Gregg asked if residents would contact the Town of the Skaneateles or the State Police directly. Supervisor Legg stated the residents would contact the law enforcement authorities directly.

**Kevin Goode, Fennell Street:** Mr. Goode asked about the enforcement and if the Town could work with the State on “photo enforcement”. This is used on the NYS Thruway.

Supervisor Legg stated the Town does not have a police department to issue citations.

**Don Lincoln, 778 Franklin Street:** Mr. Lincoln asked if this is passed, would the route be taken off GPS sights. The Board answered, hopefully but not all the GPS sights.

**Lisa Lincoln, 778 Franklin Street:** Ms. Lincoln asked if the State could contact trucking companies. Supervisor Legg stated he would be contacting the local trucking companies.

**Paul Fiutak, 2742 East Lake Road:** Mr. Fiutak stated if the State would consider dropping the tolls for trucks, it would help keep truck traffic on the thruway. He also stated the Town could consider speed bumps.

**Mike Drake, Fisher Road:** Mr. Drake stated he was in favor of this Truck Exclusion, but it has to be enforced.

Supervisor Legg stated the Town of Sennett had enacted a local law to exclude trucks on Town of Sennett roads decades ago and this pushed the truck traffic on to Skaneateles Town roads, hopefully this will help.

On a motion of Councilor Dove, seconded by Councilor Milne and with unanimous (4-0) affirmation of the Town Board, the public hearing for Local Law #2 of 2025 “A Local Law Amending Town Code Schedule VII: Truck Exclusion” was closed.

Attorney Kokkoris reviewed the following resolution:

**RESOLUTION  
OF THE TOWN BOARD  
OF THE TOWN OF SKANEATELES**

**Adopting Proposed Amendment to Section 141-32 of the Town Code**

The Town Board of the Town of Skaneateles, New York (the “Town”), duly convened in regular session on April 7, 2025, at the Town Hall located at 24 Jordan Street, Skaneateles, New York 13152 does hereby resolve as follows:

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Municipal Home Rule Law Section 20(4), Town Board Member Courtney Alexander has introduced for consideration Local Law No. 2 of 2025 entitled “A Local Law Amending Chapter 141 of the Code of the Town of Skaneateles” (the “Proposed Local Law”); and

**WHEREAS**, the purpose of the Proposed Local Law is to amend Section 141-32 of Chapter 141 of the Code of the Town of Skaneateles (the “Code”), entitled “Schedule VII: Truck



Exclusions,” to specify additional roadways where trucks, tractors and tractor-trailer combinations in excess of the indicated maximum gross weights are excluded; and

**WHEREAS,** the Town desires to comply with the requirements of SEQRA and its implementing regulations set forth at 6 NYCRR Part 617, and Section 239 of the General Municipal Law, with respect to this proposed amendment to the Code; and

**WHEREAS,** the Town has met its obligation to refer the Proposed Local Law to the Onondaga County Planning Board for its review pursuant to General Municipal Law Section 239; and

**WHEREAS,** by resolution dated March 3, 2025, the Town declared the Proposed Local Law to be a “Type II Action” pursuant to SEQRA and therefore, no further review was required; and

**WHEREAS,** the Town held a duly noticed public hearing on April 7, 2025, to obtain input from the community with respect to the Proposed Local Law.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Town hereby adopts the Proposed Local Law, and that henceforth it be designated Local Law No. 2 of 2025; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the Proposed Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the Town directs the Town Clerk to file the Proposed Local Law with the Secretary of State pursuant to Municipal Home Rule Law Section 27.

On motion of Councilor Alexander, seconded by Councilor Dove, Local Law 2 of 2025 “A Local Law Amending Chapter 141 of the Code of the Town of Skaneateles” (the entitled “Schedule VII: Truck Exclusions was adopted as presented.

**Pickleball Tournament Request – July 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup>:** Supervisor Legg announced Tom Fairhurst had requested the use of the courts at Austin Park for a pickleball tournament, July 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> . He also requested the rental fee be waived.

Parks Director Sue Murphy stated there were no conflicts for those day and she had no problem with the fee waiver.

On a motion of Councilor Alexander, seconded by Councilor Dove and with unanimous (4-0) affirmation of the Town Board, the Town Board authorized waiving the fee for the requested pickleball tournament, July 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup>.

**Amendment to the Agreement of Expenditures of Highway Monies:** Highway Superintendent Dobrovosky stated he is requesting an amendment to the 2025 agreement for the expenditure of highway money. He stated due to a change in material to a 6.3mm top course polymer modification and fiber additive. This will increase the cost by \$22,000. Also, an additional \$21,000 for the culvert replacement and paving on Gully Road.

On a motion of Councilor Alexander, seconded by Councilor Dove and with unanimous (4-0) affirmation of the Town Board, the Amended 284 Agreement for the Expenditures of Highway Monies for 2025 as presented.

**NYPA Street Lighting Contract:** Supervisor Legg stated the Board was in receipt of a contract with NYPA to maintain the Town's LED streetlights. The Board discussed this contract at the last Town Board meeting and asked Town Engineer Robinson to provide some more cost analysis for the Board.

The Board reviewed the new contract, and Councilor Alexander questioned the cost of the yearly contract fees. She reviewed the difference between the cost of a private contractor and the contract with NYPA. She asked for the cost of the NYPA contract for each year since the Town of Skaneateles had contracted with NYPA.

The Board discussed the cost and the options of street lighting maintenance. Budget Officer Fey reviewed the costs with the Board. The cost in 2023-2024 was about \$19,000. The new contract would be \$29,536 for a 2-year period.

Supervisor Legg stated currently we have no contract so we should decide, so they respond to calls.

On a motion of Councilor Alexander, seconded by Councilor Dove and with unanimous (4-0) affirmation of the Town Board, the Board approved the NYPA contract for 2025 and 2026 as presented.

**Draft Shoreline Code and Water Quality Protection Code:** Supervisor Legg stated the Board was in receipt of the draft Shoreline Code submitted by the Shoreline Committee.

Councilor Alexander stated she would like time to review this and refer the draft to the Planning and Zoning Boards and meet jointly with the Planning and Zoning Boards along with the Committee. The Board agreed.

On a motion of Councilor Alexander, seconded by Councilor Dove and with unanimous (4-0) affirmation of the Town Board, the Board referred the draft Shoreline Code and Water Protection Code to the Planning and Zoning Boards for review.



**Doug Hamlin Planning Board Member Resignation:** Supervisor Legg stated the Board was in receipt of a letter of resignation from Planning Board member Doug Hamlin. Doug was a great Board member and will be missed. The Town Board agreed to advertise for possible candidates.

On a motion of Councilor Dove, seconded by Councilor Milne and with unanimous (4-0) affirmation of the Town Board, the Board accepted the resignation of Doug Hamlin from the Planning Board and agreed to advertise for candidates.

**Howard Brodsky Town Planner Resignation:** Supervisor Legg stated the Board was in receipt of a letter of retirement/resignation from Howard Brodsky, Town Planner.

Supervisor Legg and the Board thanked Howard Brodsky for all his work with the Town.

On a motion of Councilor Dove, seconded by Councilor Milne and with unanimous (4-0) affirmation of the Town Board, the Board accepted the resignation/retirement of Howard Brodsky, Town Planner.

**Hunter Woodruff Resignation:** Supervisor Legg stated the Board was in receipt of a letter of resignation from Highway Department MEO, Hunter Woodruff. Hunter Woodruff had not been with the Highway Department long, but he was an asset to the Department and would be missed.

On a motion of Councilor Dove, seconded by Councilor Milne and with unanimous (4-0) affirmation of the Town Board, the Board accepted the resignation of Hunter Woodruff from the position of Motor Equipment Operator in the Town of Skaneateles Highway Department and agreed to advertise for candidates.

**Town of Skaneateles Employee Handbook Update – Health Insurance Benefit:** Supervisor Legg stated the Town of Skaneateles had a health insurance buy out for those employees that do not opt to take the provided health insurance coverage. This policy needed to be added to the Employee Handbook. The Town Board reviewed the following draft:

*Amount of Buy-Out – Each year, the eligible employee will receive an amount equal to twenty-five percent (25%) of the annual premium cost for medical insurance coverage under the Town plan. This payment is in addition to the compensation and/or salary to which the employee is otherwise entitled to and will be treated as part of the employee's gross income and subject to the appropriate withholding for income and payroll tax purposes. Payments made to an employee under the provisions of this buy-out option are excluded from NYS Retirement System earnings calculations.*

*Method of Payment – Partial payment of the buy-out (1/26th) will be made in the employee's regular bi-weekly paycheck for each pay-period the employee is eligible for the buyout.*

The Board agreed they had decided not to pay out on a bi-weekly basis but to pay out twice a year, in June and December.

Town Clerk Stenger stated she would send corrections to Public Sector HR Consultants to make the correction.

On a motion of Councilor Alexander, seconded by Councilor Dove and with unanimous (4-0) affirmation of the Town Board, the Board approved the amendment to the Employee Handbook as follows:

***“Amount of Buy-Out** – Each year, the eligible employee will receive an amount equal to twenty-five percent (25%) of the annual premium cost for medical insurance coverage under the Town plan. This payment is in addition to the compensation and/or salary to which the employee is otherwise entitled to and will be treated as part of the employee’s gross income and subject to the appropriate withholding for income and payroll tax purposes. Payments made to an employee under the provisions of this buy-out option are excluded from NYS Retirement System earnings calculations.*

***Method of Payment** – Payment of the buyout will occur in two installments, to be processed as part of payroll payments in June and December of the year in which coverage is waived.”*

**Finger Lakes Land Trust Request for a Gate at Coach Road and the Land Trust Property:** Supervisor Legg stated the Board had been requested by the Finger Lakes Land Trust to install a gate at the end of Coach Road which connected to the Finger Lakes Land Trust property.

Supervisor Legg stated that Andy Zepp, of the Finger Lakes Land Trust, requested with the Town’s permission to install a gate that would allow pedestrian passage but prevent unauthorized vehicles.

In the request Mr. Zepp explained they are planning to convert the existing agricultural field to a native meadow sometime this spring. The field is accessed by the northernmost of the two cul-de-sacs. According to the records, the Town’s ownership extended off the pavement into the Land Trust property. With the Town’s permission Finger Lakes Land Trust is asking to install a gate that would allow for pedestrian passage but prevent unauthorized vehicles. Both the Town and the Land Trust could have keys. Placing the gate between the field and the road is important to prevent access to an old path that angles northward toward route 20.

The Board discussed the location and the request. Attorney Kokkasis reviewed the proposed License Agreement and the Town of Skaneateles.

On a motion of Councilor Alexander, seconded by Councilor Dove and with unanimous (4-0) affirmation of the Town Board, the Board approved the License Agreement with the Finger Lakes Land Trust to install a gate at the end of Coach Road, at the Finger Lakes Land Trust’s expense, as presented. \*Resolution attached

**Congressionally Directed Spending Request for State Street Route 321 Water Transmission Line Replacement:** Supervisor Legg updated the board on the Congressional Directed Spending Request for the State Street water transmission line replacement. The Town submitted the request to Senators Schumer and Gillibrand. This would be for 80% of the funding with 20% required by the Town. This is an opportunity to ask for help with this water project.

**Request from the USDA to Trap the European Cherry Fruit Fly on Town Properties:** Supervisor Legg reported the Board was in receipt of a request from the United States Department of Agriculture for permission to trap the European Cherry Fruit Fly on Town properties.

On a motion of Councilor Milne, seconded by Councilor Alexander and with unanimous (4-0) affirmation of the Town Board, the Board approved the request from the United States Department of Agriculture for permission to trap the European Cherry Fruit Fly on Town properties.

Councilor Dove announced the assessor is meeting with property owners that wish to discuss their assessments with Mike Maxwell.

Councilor Alexander announced the Conservation Area Fishing Derby will be held on June 1<sup>st</sup> with a rain date of June 8<sup>th</sup>.

**Public Comment:**

**Joe Calipari:** Mr. Calipari thanked the Board for all their hard work. He stated he was on the Board of Assessment Review during the Town's last townwide reassessment about 10 years ago. He asked the Board where they were in the reassessment process. Supervisor Legg explained Mike Maxwell was holding informal meetings with property owners. Grievance Day is May 27<sup>th</sup>.

Mr. Calipari stated he was part of the Board of Assessment Review when the Town did the last reassessment. He stated the previous assessor Ron Miller had the values at 100% and another assessor was hired who shortly resigned. After that Mike Maxwell was appointed as the Town's part-time assessor.

Mr. Calipari stated he did not think Mr. Maxwell was qualified to be the assessor in a Town like Skaneateles. He stated the Town needed to have a full-time licensed assessor. And that is why the Town is not at 100% value.

Supervisor Legg stated that is why they are doing a reassessment to get back to 100% value. We are working with the NYS Department of Taxation to be part of their program to maintain 100% value moving forward. NYS has participated in the reassessment including the education of the property owners. With the reassessment the Town is now at 100% value.

Mr. Calipari explained his concerns about Mike Maxwell and his certification and licensing. The Board stated NYS certifies and appoints Assessors in New York State.

The Board thanked Mr. Calipari for his comments.


**Mike Drake:** Mike Drake asked the Board if Mike Maxwell is the assessor and the independent contractor? Supervisor Legg stated the Town contracted with Garr Associates and Maxwell Appraisals for this process.

Mike Drakes asked if that was a conflict to have the assessor as the independent contractor? Supervisor Legg stated it was publicly bid, and his company bid the project and came in at about \$100,000 less than the other bidders.

Councilor Dove stated they also chose Mike Maxwell's company since he knew this community and the values. Supervisor Legg stated the NYS Department of Taxation approved all the reassessed values through out this process.

On a motion of Councilor Milne, seconded by Councilor Alexander and with unanimous (5-0) affirmation of the Town Board, the meeting was adjourned at 8:35 p.m.

**Adopting Proposed Amendment to Section 141-32 of the Town Code**

The Town Board of the Town of Skaneateles, New York (the “Town”), duly convened in regular session on April 7, 2025, at the Town Hall located at 24 Jordan Street, Skaneateles, New York 13152 does hereby resolve as follows:

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Municipal Home Rule Law Section 20(4), Town Board Member Courtney Alexander has introduced for consideration Local Law No. 2 of 2025 entitled “A Local Law Amending Chapter 141 of the Code of the Town of Skaneateles” (the “Proposed Local Law”); and

**WHEREAS**, the purpose of the Proposed Local Law is to amend Section 141-32 of Chapter 141 of the Code of the Town of Skaneateles (the “Code”), entitled “Schedule VII: Truck Exclusions,” to specify additional roadways where trucks, tractors and tractor-trailer combinations in excess of the indicated maximum gross weights are excluded; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town desires to comply with the requirements of SEQRA and its implementing regulations set forth at 6 NYCRR Part 617, and Section 239 of the General Municipal Law, with respect to this proposed amendment to the Code; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town has met its obligation to refer the Proposed Local Law to the Onondaga County Planning Board for its review pursuant to General Municipal Law Section 239; and

**WHEREAS**, by resolution dated March 3, 2025, the Town declared the Proposed Local Law to be a “Type II Action” pursuant to SEQRA and therefore, no further review was required; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town held a duly noticed public hearing on April 7, 2025, to obtain input from the community with respect to the Proposed Local Law.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Town hereby adopts the Proposed Local Law, and that henceforth it be designated Local Law No. 2 of 2025; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Proposed Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State; and





Local Law 2 of the Year 2025  
A Local Law Amending  
Chapter 141 of the Code of the Town of Skaneateles

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**Section 1. Authority**

This Local Law is enacted pursuant to the provisions of the New York Town Law and the New York Municipal Home Rule Law.

**Section 2. Purpose**

The purpose of the Proposed Local Law is to amend Section 141-32 of Chapter 141 of the Code of the Town of Skaneateles (the “Code”), entitled “Schedule VII: Truck Exclusions,” to specify additional roadways where trucks, tractors and tractor-trailer combinations in excess of the indicated maximum gross weights are excluded.

**Section 3. Amendments to Code**

Section 141-32 of the Code is amended with the addition of the following roadways:

**See Exhibit A**

**Section 4. State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA)**

The Town Board has considered the provisions of Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law (“SEQRA”) and the regulations adopted thereunder at 6 NYCRR Part 617 and finds this Local Law to be a “Type II Action” as defined therein. Therefore, no further review is required under SEQRA.

**Section 5. Severability**

If a court determines that any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this Local Law or the application thereof to any person, firm or corporation, or circumstance is invalid or unconstitutional, the court’s order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder of this Local Law, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this Local Law or in its application to the person, individual, firm or corporation or circumstance, directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.

**Section 6. Effective Date**

This Local Law shall take effect upon filing with the Secretary of State.
